First, I asked DSP (Direct Support Person) Deana B., and her response was sweet and

than not becomes the student, because she is always being taught something by the consumers. Sonia is a fast-moving type of personality and stated that she really enjoys spending time on activities with the consumers. They keep her on the move and laughing with their many jokes.

Finally, I asked DSP Maryann R. who, right away, had four great answers: First, she said she LOVES the smiles

the consumers greet her with! Then, she commented on how the consumers often give her new ways of looking at things, other than she normally would. This is very important because without diverse opinions, the world would be a pretty boring place. Third, she says the consumers give her back tons of positives. For example, they just want a hug or want someone to talk to and have someone to talk back with them. It's obvious these little things make them happy. She finished by

A Different Kind of Who's Who...

What kind of difference did Open Door make?

At Open Door, we have consumers who live and work with us, live with families and come to work during the day, and clients that live with another agency and come to our workshop during the week for more suitable programming that meets their needs. This is a story about a family who worked with Open Door through two agencies, always holding out for a residential opening here with us: The Hage Family – Sue, Lee and Kyle.

At the age of twenty-three, Kyle went to live at his first residential placement in 1997 and to Open Door for work placement services in our workshop. His parents, Sue and Lee, were hopeful for a residential opening here at Open Door. They were very pleased with the day programming and work that we provided, as Kyle wanted to be at a location where his functioning level was met. The family felt we provided an environment where Kyle felt empowered and comfortable. In 2002, Kyle's residential provider closed their doors. Unfortunately, Open Door still did not have a residential opening for Kyle.

When Kyle moved to his next residential placement, he was able to continue with Open Door for his day programming and work. Again, the Hage family was always hopeful for a residential placement at Open Door. In 2009, Open Door finally had an opening, and Kyle and his family jumped at the opportunity. According to Kyle and his family, he wanted a home where he could feel safe and treated like an adult;

they felt that Open Door would be that place.

When talking with Sue, she made it very clear why she wanted Kyle to be at Open Door. "The atmosphere at the workshop was warm and inviting, the staff were all so kind and the clients were always happy and busy," she said. Kyle felt that his level of functioning was higher than most places treated him, which was true, "But Open Door worked with him at the appropriate level, which made Kyle a lot happier," she added.

Once Kyle moved into an Open Door group home, we basically started from scratch. His financial situation was not well documented,

his doctors were scattered through several different areas and towns and his medication history was incomplete and

inappropriate. After a new evaluation, we began to build a new network of physicians to get Kyle back on track and get him healthy again. Within six months of placement, he had gained weight, health issues were getting balanced and back to normal and medications were reworked, which provided much needed relief to his diagnoses and provided Kyle with the stability he had been missing for so long. For the first time in many years, Kyle was fully self sufficient in his finances.

“The comfort level is tremendous,” said Sue, “no more fears of him not being taken care of!” It took time for Sue and Lee to fully understand how Open Door provided services. They were surprised by how open the communication was and that at all times they were kept informed on progress or changes. In fact, Sue and Lee attended doctors’ appointments so they themselves could ask questions of the doctor treating Kyle. They were told they could ask about anything, from money to medication to activities to eating habits; we had no secrets. This was a new concept for them to grasp, but as the relationships were built, trust was built as well. “The supervision of the residential staff, the involvement of the Case Managers and the Administration is amazing,” Sue stated. “I can talk to anyone, go to anyone and all my questions are answered. Everyone is on the same page and is a real team.”

Sue continues, “What I love the most is the variety and choices the clients all have. Whether its day programming, work, activities...it’s the clients’ choice and they get to plan

their own lives. Kyle is a big fan of shopping trips and going out to eat. When it comes to day programs, he has been in every play, loves the history classes and is a big part of the broadcasting team. Kyle has really come a long way with self esteem and trusting his decisions. He used to say “ok” to everything but would then not want to do whatever it was. Then he finally started to express himself to likes and dislikes, knowing it was well within his rights to make choices HE wanted without someone changing it or making him do something else.” Sue and Lee

have been extremely generous to the programs at Open Door. They are always offering help in one form or another and really feel that it is appreciated; which it is, tremendously!

Another issue that has improved is the Hage family relationship. “There are no secrets, no gossip about clients or families and everywhere you go is warm and inviting,” Sue said. Over the course of the last couple of years, Lee, began attending more meetings and events as a result of the trust that was built. “Our relationship with Kyle has improved a lot,” said Sue, “and the families of the clients are cared for as well as the clients themselves. Open Door works with the families as a whole and that means so much.”

Thankfully, the Hage family never gave up on a residential opening at Open Door. We will always strive to do our best in making sure that everyone, not just Kyle, is cared for, given a voice, able to make choices and decisions, without fear, judgment, or prejudice. Our motto “Helping People Help Themselves,” in this case, should be “Helping Families and People Help Themselves.”

Don't Turn Your Back on a Fire!

In an unpredictable world, Open Door staff prides themselves on their safety skills and monthly fire drills. Thanks to the help and support of our Sandwich Community Fire Protection District, we are also able to continue to encourage the same for the consumers. Firemen Gene Leopold and Kerry Boring stopped by to teach some of the consumers about how to put out fires. What makes this all the more interesting is that Firemen Gene and Kerry literally turned up the heat as we not only used real extinguishers, but a real fire was used as well!

In a class setting, the firemen took turns talking about fire safety in the home and how to prevent fires from starting in the first place. We learned such tricks as to not overload electrical outlets and to not only keep our dryer vents clean, but to never leave a dryer running unattended. Rosie B. asked the firemen if she “could use a soda instead of water to put out a fire in a trash can.” This brought on a great discussion about checking fire extinguishers to know what kind of fires they will put out and a big yes for Rosie, that soda certainly can be used instead of water.

Our firemen friends then taught us how to use a fire extinguisher using the P.A.S.S. method. Pull the pin, Aim the hose at the base of the fire, Squeeze the handle, and Sweep back and forth. After learning the basics, Sue C. said “it is good to know how to use

one of those in case there is a fire.” We also learned how to check the fire extinguishers to make sure they are still good. Fireman Kerry said to “Keep the needle in green.” Gene’s wise advise was simply stated, “Once you think a fire is out, don’t turn your back to it until you know it is out.”

Then came the moment of truth when we stepped outside to the parking lot to demonstrate our new skills. Fireman Kerry had set up a large metal box in which he safely added a flammable substance and set it on fire using a flare deftly secured to a very long stick. The flames were daunting but each and every member of the class, with Fireman Gene on the ready, took the challenge and put out the fire. Lisa T. said that the “phsspsshh” sound from the extinguisher was her favorite part and that the firemen were “cute.”

Fire safety is an important matter for everyone. While the consumers were told that if a fire should occur, their first priority is to leave the building for a safe place. They were also told that they should ask questions and help to make sure that their houses and such are safe. Stephanie K. made us all proud when she made the statement that “I’m going to check my extinguishers at home.” Thank you, Stephanie, for keeping us all on our toes, and thanks again to the Sandwich Community Fire Protection District for allowing Firemen Gene and Kerry teach us how to prevent fires and stay safe.
